## Career Tech Ed Courses (CTE)

## Current Offerings:

- Welding
- Automotive
- Machining
- Foods
- Health Occupations (1 \& 2)

Classes held at Menominee High School.
Each course counts as 2.5 credits of electives or VPAA courses.

Students will be bused to MHS at the beginning of the day.

They will return to complete 4 additional courses at SHS.

These may include:

- core class requirements
- online electives
- college courses (dual enrollment courses or EMC courses)

Students enrolled in CTE courses may earn vocational certification (such as CNA) or credit toward other certificate programs.

When aligned with student EDP (personal education plans/career) goals, CTE students may also apply for Work-Based Learning programs.

## Dual Enrollment College Courses

## Partnership with Bay College / NWTC:

- Must apply through the Student Success Office.
- Earn credit for up to 10 courses
- Complete many basic requirements

Most coursework is online / Blackboard.
SAPS district pays for tuition (students must reimburse costs for any failed classes).

Parents will sign course selection forms each semester; must note if students want the course on their transcripts.

Each semester course $=1$ full high school credit if applied to high school transcript (and also calculates in HS GPA).

Overview of \# courses to take:
Gr. 10 start: 1 course/semester in gr. 10;
2 courses each semester in gr. $11 \& 12$.
Gr. 11 start: 2 courses each semester in grade 11 \& 3 courses each semester in 12. Gr. 12 start: maximum of 3 courses $/ \mathrm{sem}$.

Scheduling: 1 course $=1 \mathrm{HS}$ class period 2 courses = up to 3 HS periods
3 courses = up to 4 HS periods

## Early Middle College (Year 5)

## Partnership with Bay College / NWTC:

- Must apply by October 1 of junior year to be eligible for acceptance
- Will receive support from Student Success Office and a mentor teacher
Students begin pursuing their career goals upon signing up through high school classes, CTE and/or dual enrollment.

Students may decide to leave the program at any point before graduation.

## Program plans include:

- Vocational certifications
- Associates Degree programs
- MEMCA certificate completion

Students completing the fifth year will:

- still walk for graduation with their class at the end of their senior year.
- earn scholarships their senior year.
- still qualify for free/reduced meals at SHS during year \#5.

Concurrent Enrollment: SAPS offers some classes for both high school and college credit.
