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Pick up - Drop off

Parents we are implementing a new pick up and drop off process. We have had some reports of unsafe driving at dismissal and drop off. We are working to improve the flow of traffic and increase safety for our students. To that end, we would like to be proactive in explicitly stating what our procedures are and we appreciate your adherence to the following procedures.

Drop off procedures:

- Drop off school side curb ONLY.
- Do not park in student parking, you must be parked at the school side curb.
- Do not park/stop in the road next to a parked car to let your child/ren out.

Pick up procedures:

- We have many parents waiting to pick up their child/ren, please do not remain in a spot once your child/ren are in your vehicle.
- Stay in your vehicle and pull forward when a spot opens in front of you.
- Do not park/stop in the road next to a parked car, students will not be released to your vehicle unless you are at the school side curb.
- Do not park in student parking, you must be parked at the school side curb.

Parents, we have requested that the sheriff department monitor our school area and ticket parents/students that speed in our school zone.

In addition, we have requested as well that the city add school speed limit signs.
